The Pastor's Reflection

"Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me." (Jn 15:3)

Dear brothers and sisters in the Lord:

Happy Easter!

On the Fifth Sunday of Easter, Jesus invites us to "abide in him". This discourse was spoken on the night before he was betrayed and crucified. The vine is a biblical image of Israel. Being the true vine, Jesus reaffirms yet again that he is the Divine Son of the Heavenly Father who was sent for our salvation. All of us who have been baptized are called branches. Our spiritual growth is commensurate with our obedience and adherence to Christ.

In order for a branch to be healthy, it must receive lymph from the vine. In order for a Catholic to remain spiritually healthy, he or she must receive the Eucharist weekly. This allows the Precious Body and Blood of Jesus Christ to flow through us. To be even more accurate, we could say that we become assimilated into Him. In the Spirit of the Liturgy, Cardinal Ratzinger wrote that when we eat food, it becomes a part of our own bodies. However, when we receive the Eucharist, we become part of Christ's body. Catholics who do not go to Sunday Mass will never be able to grow into the image and likeness of the Lord. Eventually, we begin to die spiritually. Sadly, I know this from my own personal experience.

This Sacrament of Charity is meant to produce many good fruits, all guided by love. Do I help my neighbour? Do I forgive others? Am I willing to defend my faith? Do I actively avoid sin and seek to live a virtuous life? Do I make every effort to help the poor? Do I know of people who are housebound and lonely and visit them? Do I go to Sunday Mass and pray daily at home? Do I encourage my family to do so too? The more we seek to remain in union with Christ, the holier we will become. After all, this is our universal vocation as Catholics.
