The Pastor's Reflection

"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." (Mt 8:34)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

This Sunday, our Lord teaches us that authentic discipleship has a cost. Imagine the crowd and his disciples hearing these words? They must have been horrified to see crucified men and women lining the road leading into the city. These individuals were put to death for going against the Roman Empire. Who would not be shocked? Is Jesus telling us that the Christian life is meant to be a life filled with perpetual sorrow and pain?

St Teresa of Avila's mission was to establish newly reformed Carmelite Monasteries. On one of journeys, she was thrown off of her carriage and landed into a pool of mud and water. In her frustration she cried out to the Lord and heard him say: "This is how I treat all my friends." She replied, "No wonder you have so few!" St Teresa was very bold indeed and it is understandable that she was upset. Yet, this is the same woman who would go into such profound ecstasies that the other sisters in the convents thought she was dead!

One must always remember it is a great privilege and honour to be known and loved by God and have him live within the throne of our hearts. However, it does require a real daily commitment. Why? Love requires sacrifice. True love involves suffering because it involves the need to die to one's own ego and put another before us. Moreover, it is not always returned in kind. Jesus loved everyone around him, yet they crucified him.

So what does it mean to pick up one's cross? Some saints and martyrs were tested in the greatest possible way. Through particular graces, they are called to have a greater share in Christ's Passion. Think about St Pedro Calungsod, the great saint martyr from the Philippines who was killed for evangelizing his own people. Or St Marguerite d'Youville who was slandered in her attempts to do good for the love of God! For most of us, we are called to accept the disagreeable things in daily life so that we can learn to grow in generosity and love towards God and others. Those of you who are married know this in a special way. Whether you are tired or sick, you still have a family to feed and care for. We grow closer to God, each time we put aside our own desires for the good of someone else. It may be painful to do so, especially if we are not

used to being generous. Remember, generosity will bear much good fruit both in this life and in eternity.
