The Pastor's Reflection

"Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the contributors other to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus

wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." (Mk 12:44)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

The Temple was divided into many different courts. The collection boxes were found in the Court of the Women. This was a very large area that could hold thousands of people. People would walk into the court and toss their offerings into a collection box. Each collection receptacle looked like a trumpet. The more money one would throw into the box, the more noise it made, drawing the attention of other worshippers. The poor woman in today's Gospel had so very little to offer. The two tiny coins she tossed into the trumpet as a contribution to the treasury, made no sound.

Many people think that Jesus' comment was an endorsement and acknowledgment of the fact that the poor woman gave all that she had. Is this really the case? Does Jesus want the poor to become even poorer? Absolutely not! Just before this part of today's Gospel, Jesus had just condemned the religious scribes who used religion for their own financial gain. He said, "They devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext recite lengthy prayers," (Mk 12:40)

Jesus condemns a corrupt system that uses religion to fulfill the corrupt desires of some religious leaders. Everyone is called to give sacrificially to the Church for her upkeep and the advancement of her mission. This call is not the issue. The problem lies in the fact that the Temple leaders failed to care for the widows and the poor and provide them with the means necessary to live according to their inherent dignity. This was not being done. That is the problem, a big problem indeed!
