

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

"Drop down dew from above, you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One; let the earth be opened and bring forth a Saviour." (Cf. Isaiah 45.8)



The Pastor's Reflection

"Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." (Lk 1:42)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

We are just two days away from Christmas! God willing, the Advent season was a time for prayerful reflection and spiritual discernment.

In today's Gospel, Mary finally arrives at her cousin Elizabeth's house. She had been contemplating everything the Archangel Gabriel had told her at the Annunciation. When Elizabeth hears the Virgin's voice, she cries out with great joy. Luke tells us that Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit and says, "blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." (Lk 1:42). Elizabeth continues, "how does this happen to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? (Lk 1:43). Did you grasp what Elizabeth just said under the guidance of the Third Person of the Trinity? She called Mary the mother of her Lord: the baby in her womb was God himself.

Every Jewish woman hoped that she would be the mother of the Messiah. But to be the Mother of God? One should fall to the ground in awe before such a great mystery! St. Augustine goes on to say that the Virgin Mary's greatness lies in the fact that she is the Theotokos (God-bearer), and, because she is Christ's preeminent disciple. The Virgin Mary shows us the royal way to follow her Son.

If you pray the rosary, and I hope you do daily, you will notice that we use the same words of St. Elizabeth when we pray the Hail Mary. This prayer is biblical in origin. We begin with the words of St Gabriel when he greets her by saying "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you." (Lk 1:26-8). Moreover, the name of Jesus, the only name that saves (Acts 4:12), is at the center of this divinely inspired prayer.

There are some well-meaning but misguided people who criticize the Church and Catholics for our devotion to the Mother of God. They are wrong, plain and simple. Mary's role as intercessor goes beyond Christmas and continues until Christ's Second Coming. Turn to her often, she loves us and wants us to experience both the love of God and her own maternal care. Keep in mind what the Virgin Mary said when she appeared in Guadalupe over 500 years ago on Dec 12th, "Let not your heart be disturbed...Am I not here, your Mother? Are you not under my protection? Am I not your health? Are you not happily within my fold? What else do you wish? Do not grieve nor be disturbed by anything."
