FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God." (Psalm 94.6-7)



"Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." (Lk 5:10)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

I must admit that today's Gospel is one of my favorite moments

between St. Peter and Jesus. Peter is tired. He worked hard all night at a job he knew inside out and yet, he had nothing to show for it. We know that he wasn't born a saint.

We can imagine this great man murmuring and quite frustrated for he was known for his quick temper. Yet, the gaze of Jesus Christ caught his attention. It was not like the others. It was like Jesus was looking right inside the very core of Peter. To the surprise of his fellow fisherman, Peter obeyed Christ's command to go back and fish again. Perhaps St. Peter's response was a miracle in itself. The strong fisherman obeys the command of a stranger, who does not look like he is experienced in the same profession. Due to their obedience, the fishermen were overwhelmed with the quantity of fish they themselves had never before managed to catch (cf. Simone Chiamato Pietro, Lepori, 2010).

The penetrating look of Christ, coupled with the miraculous catch, was enough for St. Peter to realize that the man standing before him was unlike anyone he had met before. Luke tells us that "he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." (Lk 5:10). Why did he say that? The look of Christ is otherworldly. He has the capacity to look right into the heart of man. People can see our actions and listen to our words, but "only God can see the heart." (1 Sam 16:7)

Peter recognized that Jesus could see everything, even the things that his family and friends could not. Perhaps he sensed that the Lord was about to ask him to do something that he was afraid to do. What is most moving is that Jesus doesn't agree with him and says "You are right, Peter. I will move on and find a better man." No! Jesus says, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people' (Lk 5:11). The Lord sees the entire person, not just what is wrong with him or her.

Jesus is always in search of us. He meets us at work, like he did with St Peter, at home, on the streets, in Church. The Lord is always calling us to listen and follow his will for our lives. By the grace of God, Peter obeyed, even though he did not fully understand nor know that he would eventually become the first Pope of the Catholic Church! Who knows what God has in store for each of us. He calls us to trust and obey his words.

What do you think God is saying to you personally today? Do not be afraid!

1. The Canada Revenue Agency has confirmed that it has extended the deadline for making charitable donations eligible to be claimed on a donor's 2024 income tax return until February 28, 2025. 
