

## Weekly Biblical Reflection

"Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you." (Lk 1:28)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

This Sunday, we celebrate our Patronal Feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. Each year, this feast is normally celebrated on Oct 7th. This year, the feast day falls on a weekday. For the benefit of the parish, the Chancellor of Spiritual Affairs has given us permission to celebrate this feast today, when most of our community is present.

The historical events that influenced the promulgation of this feast are fascinating. According to Catholic News Agency, "In 1571, three Catholic powers – Genoa, Spain, and the Papal States - formed an alliance called the Holy League, to defend their Christian civilization against Turkish invasion. Its fleets sailed to confront the Turks near the west coast of Greece on October 7, 1571. Crew members on more than 200 ships prayed the Rosary in preparation for the battle - as did Christians throughout Europe, encouraged by the Pope to gather in their churches to invoke the Virgin Mary against the daunting Turkish forces. Turkish victory at Lepanto would have been a catastrophe of the first magnitude for Christendom," wrote military historian John F. Guilmartin, Jr., "and Europe would have followed a historical trajectory strikingly different from that which obtained."

When we look at the state of our world today, we constantly see and hear about "wars and rumours of war" (Mt 24:6). There is no world peace. There is little peace in our own homes and communities. All of this can make us feel helpless. However, we are not powerless. We have only to turn to God and begin to pray. European Christians felt helpless in the 1500s, and they cried out with one voice to the Virgin Mary. Like a good mother, the Holy Virgin heard their prayers and interceded for her children. Europe was spared.

This feast teaches us there is no situation in life so perilous that faithful prayer is unable to help. But why pray the rosary, you may ask? When we pray the rosary correctly, we are praying to God with and through his mother. We reflect on Christ's life, passion, death, and resurrection. Moreover, we consider Mary's role in Jesus' life and ours too. The simple prayer of the rosary guarantees the presence of Jesus Christ. The Lord taught us that "where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." (Mt 18:20). There are at least two people present when we pray the rosary: you and Our Lady. It means that Jesus Christ is

present among us. Pray the rosary! It is a very powerful prayer indeed.


