

## Weekly Biblical Reflection

"God, I thank you that I am not like other people."

Today's readings present us with two very different approaches to faith. One that revolves around pride and another that is founded in humility. The first reading reminds us that God cares for the lowly, and our Gospel, the parable of the Pharisee and tax collector, contrasts self-righteousness with humility.

We can all be tempted, in one way or another, to measure ourselves by how good or religious we are. We may even compare ourselves with "those people" over there, or within our own community, quietly saying, "Well, at least I'm not like them." Today, we are being strongly warned against this because the parable is not about comparing ourselves but about entering more deeply into God's mercy and love.

"God hears the prayers of the humble." When we pray, we are asked to pour out our hearts before the Lord, because that is when God is attentive. Maybe ask ourselves, "When was the last time I prayed simply because I was in need, without showing others how devout or pious I am? The humble, needy heart is exactly where God meets us. The proud are already standing tall, so they see no need for God's help.

Today, we see how the Pharisee stands proudly, listing his virtues, thanking God that he is not like "that tax collector over there." The tax collector, by contrast, stands far off, not even lifting his eyes, beating his chest: "God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

Humility opens our hearts to grace. The Pharisee's prayer is all about himself, what he did, and what he is. The tax collector's prayer is about God's mercy. One trusts in himself, the other in God. When we look at ourselves, are we praying to be seen, or are we like the tax collector, contrite, acknowledging dependence, asking for mercy?

We are not being asked to compare ourselves to these two people, but to actually do the opposite and avoid comparison. This is not a contest. The problem wasn't that the Pharisee was righteous but that he boasted about it. When we compare ourselves, we lose sight and just become spectators, not participants.

Mercy should shape us, leading us to an internal conversion, moving us from self-justification to reliance on God's mercy. It's all about recognizing how much we need God, every moment of every day.


If you find yourself feeling weighed down by guilt, failure, or anything, please know that your tears, struggles, and especially your earnest prayers are heard. Let this simple prayer of the tax collector: "God, have mercy on me, a sinner." carry you toward God.

Let us build a life and parish where humility is honoured, mercy is offered, and no one is judged by their outward appearances, but welcomed for their sincerity of heart.


