

ALL SOULS' DAY

"God who raised Jesus from the dead, will give life to your mortal bodies, through his Spirit that dwells in you." (Cf. Romans 8.11)

Weekly Biblical Reflection

"The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God." (Wisdom 3:1)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

Today, the universal Church celebrates the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed, commonly known as All Souls. This is the day when Masses are offered for the deceased who have died in the grace of God and who are awaiting arrival in heaven.

From ancient times, Catholics have always understood that we must pray for the deceased. One can find ample evidence of inscriptions with prayers for the dead in the catacombs in Rome and elsewhere in the world that date back to apostolic times. Why did this venerable act of charity become an issue in certain Christian communities? To make a long story short, there were issues related to the interpretation of Scripture, reaction to the "sale of indulgences", and an incorrect understanding of the nature of justification.

There are also many Catholics who regrettably believe that we all go directly to heaven as soon as we die, and fail to remember and pray for their deceased loved ones. While it is possible to ascend directly to heaven upon death, most of us have to experience full healing from the consequences of sins forgiven. The process of healing is an act of mercy on the part of God. Jesus tells us that "nothing unclean can enter into heaven." (Rev 21:27)

Purgatory is the process where we are healed by the fire of God's love. It is a place of suffering and not of punishment. The suffering comes from God's eternal love that comes into contact with the painful wounds we created within ourselves from having sinned. You bring relief to the deceased in Purgatory when you offer Masses, rosaries, fasts, and acts of almsgiving to the poor. This is why we offer Masses for the dead this day, and throughout the week. Once purified and healed, they are admitted into the Beatific Vision of God. Their gratitude has no limits, and they, in turn, help us in our own journey in life and death.

My maternal grandmother died in 2002. I remember dreaming about her. She was blind and asked me to help her. I understood that she was not yet in heaven. So, I prayed and prayed for a long time. I dreamt of my grandmother one night in 2006 while studying theology in Rome. This time she looked very different. Nonna looked like she was in her late 40's, with brilliant white

hair, and sitting on a small throne. She was surrounded by all her children and grandchildren, and Nonna Angela looked utterly radiant. She was pointing upwards and telling us all about heaven. Nonna beamed with joy. It was then that I understood she had finally entered eternal glory.

Pray for your loved ones. They are in desperate need of our assistance. Once they die, they are unable to pray for themselves.. May all of the faithful departed be assisted by our humble prayers.
