

# Weekly Biblical Reflection

Beloved brothers and sisters in the Lord:

Today is the Second Sunday of Advent. The Church presents us with the mysterious figure of John the Baptist, who is the opposite of what our secular culture proposes for our veneration. John the Baptist is calling everyone to conversion, and he begins with himself. Unlike the many puffed-up false saviours of our time, John the Baptist is truly humble. He knows who he is, and more importantly, who he is not. John the Baptist declares he is not the Christ, the Anointed One. Nevertheless, he also knows that he has an important mission. Matthew explains John's mission by quoting from the Prophet Isaiah. "The voice of one crying out in the desert, make his paths straight." (Mt 3:2). John the Baptist is the one called by God to prepare the way for the coming of the real Messiah, Jesus Christ.

Many people thought that John the Baptist was the messiah. In fact, the Sanhedrin sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to find out who exactly this man was, wearing camel hair and living off locusts and honey. The Sanhedrin had every good reason to be concerned, as there were many false messiahs during the time of John the Baptist.

Even today, the Vatican is rightfully prudent when someone claims to have received a supernatural mission or vision. There is much investigation into an alleged private revelation. In fact, today's second reading tells us that we "should not despise prophetic utterances." (I Thess 5:3). The Church does not question whether it is possible to receive a vision or supernatural mission. The question remains whether this mission/vision is truly from God rather than a person's imagination, or worse, the devil.

As we continue to prepare for Christmas, let us remember that it was Christ alone who came to "bring glad tidings to the poor, heal the broken-hearted, proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners..." (Is 61: 1-2). The prophets of ancient times prophesied that Jesus was the one to come and save us from sin.

Let us reach out to the many men and women who are isolated and lonely. St Paul reminds us that our faith in Christ should urge us to "welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God." (Rm 15: 7)

Perhaps there is someone in our lives who is estranged from us that we might consider reaching out to this Christmas. Welcome this person to your dinner table and realize it will become a graced moment of reconciliation and peace.


